Funds are for a **Vine Trust** building project in Tanzania. Ryan, a 3rd year pupil at Millburn Academy, has been selected with 20+ other school pupils to join the Vine Trust Project. This charity gets pupils and locals working together, building homes for vulnerable families in the community – many are orphans.



The Mission:

Each pupil has to raise £4,000 for the project and so far Ryan has been holding car boot sales and doing bag packing at supermarkets. His quiz sheet was popular as was Tilly's dog walking challenge and also selling ice lollies at a school disco.

Ryan says: "I really enjoy all my practical subjects at school, woodwork, metal work and construction which is why the Tanzania project appealed to me. Next year I have been accepted for a day release course at Inverness UHI Campus to add to my practical skills. In the meantime I am making herb gardens from old pallets."
